

2 Music & Fine Arts

Music, movement and drama (MMD) are an integral part of our learning at Stavely School. Children naturally love music and movement, as it plays an essential role in child development. It is a type of language that encourages self-expression, imagination, and social development. Our students excel at ASL (American Sign Language), where hand signs and facial expression are used to communicate the lyrics of songs. Combining drama with music increases creativity, cooperation, and confidence. Role-playing (taking on the character of another person) increases empathy and perspective-taking. our MMD classes beginning in September, we studied music genres throughout history. We explored the importance of music in society, and how famous performers changed history. We incorporated dance and movement from these performers through watching videos and doing research. Our students fully grasp music dynamics such as rhythm, tempo, and pitch. They enjoy using their voices to sing, their hands to play instruments and wave scarves, their feet to learn movement patterns and dance choreography, and reflecting on personal feelings. The Christmas Concert ("Time-Travelling Santa") showcased the skills the students acquired, as well as captured their joy in performing. It was a meaningful experience from November 1st to December 22nd as we collaborated to introduce new songs, instruments, and movement, role-play, and memorize script lines. Rehearsals required intensity, focus and energy, and our students blossomed! They developed into confident performers! School staff rehearsed with students on the days I wasn't at the school, assisted with set design, costumes and props. Parent Council provided funds for costumes, parents decorated the stage and created backdrops. The dedication and teamwork of the entire school and community

We are excited to work on new math units like patterns and shapes soon, as well as continue growing our alphabet knowledge. There is lots more to learn in kindergarten through work and play.
